- I. Roll Call Commissioners (Chair Ordaz, Vice Chair White, Secretary Kooiker, DeKock, Elsloo)**
a. Recognition of Agency Leadership Ordaz called to order at 1:16 pm. All commissioners present plus Katie Fiala – Asst AG, Kristin Johnson and Kaitlin Smith from staff.
- II. Approval of Minutes from September 20 and October 4.** Motion by DeKock, 2nd by Elsloo to accept, including the October 4 corrections noted by Secretary Kooiker. Motion Carried unanimously.
- III. Acceptance of Agenda** Motion to approve the agenda with moving the Strategic Planning to be next in the agenda. Motion by White, 2nd by Elsloo. Motion Carried unanimously.
- IV. Public Comment (oral or written) – pursuant to public decorum rules adopted on August 16, 2024, public comment shall be limited to four minutes.** No comments and no members of the public present.

- V. AG Update** Katie Fiala, sexual harassment / civil rights case to Iowa Court of Appeals, and a few other cases pending trial. Her reading of the code (SF 2385 – p82-100 of the bill) is the Commissioners may look at files that are closed. The information in those files would stay confidential. SF2268 changed the animal assistance form.

a. Discuss budget appropriation for Commission for FY25-26
b. Continued discussion on mission and goals. White noted she has confirmed other agencies, commissions have concern as well regarding the prior legislation. She is also planning to meet with a legislator soon. DeKock also spoke with a legislator. White provided a draft mission statement for consideration: The Iowa Civil Rights Commission is dedicated to upholding justice and fairness by thoroughly reviewing appeals related to civil rights violations. We strive to ensure that every case is evaluated with integrity, transparency, and respect for all individuals involved. Our mission is to foster an equitable society by promoting accountability and providing a platform for marginalized voices.

Kooiker asked about the report timeframe, and Smith said she would find out. By consensus this will be on the next agenda.

IOWA CIVIL RIGHTS COMMISSION PUBLIC MEETING FORUM RULES

Below are the rules adopted by the Iowa Civil Rights Commission on August 16, 2024

Public Comment is the Civil Rights Commission’s opportunity to hear comments from you at the beginning of the Civil Rights Commission meeting for items both on and off the agenda. During Public Comment, the Civil Rights Commission receives comments and refrains from speaking. The Chairperson may ask the Executive Director to follow up regarding public comments received. The number of speakers will not usually be limited at the public comment; total length of the comment period is desired to not exceed ½ hour, and may be lengthened at the discretion of the Chairperson.

Anyone who wants to speak during Public Comment Period should do the following:

1. Raise your hand to be recognized by the Chairperson and then come to the podium and state your name and county. If you have handouts, please give them to the Executive Director before the meeting.
2. Be concise and limit comments to four minutes. You may not save your time for later or yield the remainder of your time to someone else. After speaking, please be seated.
3. If you are addressing a matter on the agenda, state the agenda item you are speaking about and if you are speaking on more than one agenda item, arrange your comments in chronological order.
4. Try not to duplicate information that has already been presented.
5. Direct comments to the entire Commission and not to an individual. Questions and issues raised during this time will generally not be answered during this time.
6. Maintain a courteous and respectful manner.
7. If you are the presenter on an item which has been formally placed on the Commission’s agenda, this public forum process does not apply, although you are asked to be succinct in your presentation.
8. Iowa law requires certain matters to have public hearings, which have their own comment periods. Comments pertaining to a public hearing item should be saved for that item, and the four-minute comment period will also apply for public hearings.
