- I. Roll Call Commissioners (Chair Ordaz, Vice Chair White, Secretary Kooiker, DeKock, Elsloo)
  a. Recognition of Agency Leadership 1:17 pm: Present, White, De Kock, Elsloo, Kooiker
  Staff: Kristen Stiffler, Kaitlin Smith and AAG Katie Fiala
- **II. Approval of Minutes from November 22.** *Motion by Elsloo,*  $2^{nd}$  *by Kooiker with several amendments. Motion carried unanimously.*
- III. Acceptance of Agenda. Motion by DeKock, 2nd by Elsoo to approve. Motion carried unanimously.
- IV. Public Comment (oral or written) pursuant to public decorum rules adopted on August 16, 2024, public comment shall be limited to four minutes. *None*.
- **V. AG Update.** By AAG Fiala update on Cianzio v ISU, re Section 216.6A. Allows for recovery for the period of discrimination.
- **VI. Director's update.** Currently a posting for a new position in the office, education and outreach coordinator *Program Planner II.*
- VII. Timeframe for appeals, potential recommendation for change to the ICRA. A complaint can now be filed up to 11:59 pm on the 300<sup>th</sup> day. The rules have been updated accordingly. HUD is 365 days, EEOC is 300 days, everything else is 300 days. Stiffler offered to look at the HUD data and see if a query was possible to determine the number of rejected HUD cases,
- VIII. Clarification on terms of office for reappointed commissioners. There are discussions with the Governor's office on the staggering of the terms of office. The position in the Governor's office working with appointments has recently changed. The current understanding is the terms expire at the same time as previous, although this is recognized that with some commissioners there will be proportionately more vacancies.

  - a. Commissioner Don DeKock's updates on legislator meetings *DeKock has been talking to legislators, open to change, but no one he has talked to is currently planning to seek changes.*
